

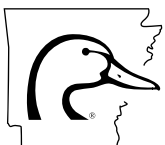
ARKANSAS WATERFOWL HUNTERS, DID YOU KNOW?

Nobody cares for Arkansas waterfowl hunters more than Ducks Unlimited. Our vital habitat work, research and public policy efforts help preserve our waterfowl hunting heritage for future generations!

- The Prairie Pothole Region (PPR) and the Mississippi Alluvial Valley are two of DU's top conservation priorities. The PPR provides Arkansas with the vast majority of our waterfowl migration.
- DU and our conservation partners have conserved more than 6 million acres of critical waterfowl habitat in the states and provinces that make up the Prairie Pothole Region.
- DU and our partners have performed more than \$44 million worth of conservation work in Arkansas that has impacted over 344,000 acres.
- DU has proudly worked on every public land managed for waterfowl in Arkansas. The vast majority of these projects are open to public hunting, including, but not limited to, Bayou Meto WMA, Cache River NWR, Black River WMA, White River NWR, Hurricane Lake WMA, Frog Bayou WMA, and Raft Creek WMA.
- DU is the only waterfowl conservation organization that delivers continent wide habitat conservation work to promote healthy waterfowl populations.
- The best way Arkansas waterfowl hunters can help protect critical waterfowl habitat is by volunteering for their local DU committee.
- Waterfowl hunters founded DU in 1937 and hunters make up more than 90% of our current membership.
- DU is the only waterfowl conservation organization with a Washington D.C. staff whose purpose is to work with lawmakers to see that waterfowl needs are represented when congressional issues will have an impact on waterfowl habitat.



- DU ranks 120 out of almost 1,000,000 non-profit organizations in the United States in terms of organizational efficiency.
- Because our members and Board of Directors believe so strongly in our conservation mission, at least 80% of every dollar raised by DU is dedicated towards our conservation efforts.
- While DU's #1 priority is waterfowl, more than 900 wildlife species benefit from our continental conservation work.
- DU has conserved more than 12 million acres of waterfowl habitat in North America, more than any other conservation organization in existence.
